# IACUC -Institutional Animal Care and Use Committee

What?

Committee to oversee animal care in research and teaching 1. U.S. Federal requirement

1966 -Public Law 89-544

- 2. Committee established by institutions (Research, Universities)
- 3. Oversee animals used in research or instruction
- 4. Evaluate all aspects of the animal care and use

What?

Primary function is to assist scientists uphold the law

- 1. Primary function is to assist faculty students and staff uphold the law.
- 2. Help make decisions about humane use of animals.
- 3. Therefore: every project must be approved by IACUC *prior* to initiation.
- 5. IACUC does not evaluate the science directly.





Why should you comply?

The use of animals for research, teaching, or exhibition is a privilege, not a right. Florida Gulf Coast University maintains an Animal Welfare Assurance Statement which declares its compliance with the various regulations and policies.

Failure by any individual to adhere to these standards can jeopardize FGCU's entire animal use program. This is bad.
