- 1) Title of the proposal you are reviewing
- 2) Summary Paragraph (< 100 words)
 - a. Write a one-paragraph summary of the research proposal. This paragraph ensures that you understand the project.
- 3) Line By Line
 - a. Use line numbers to identify specific strengths and weaknesses within the text.
 - i. For example, "line 32 there is a typo change turkey to turkeys."
 - ii. For example, "line 52 I love this example."
- 4) Strengths (< 200 words)
 - a. Summary outlining the strengths of the proposal
 - i. Revisit the peer review guidelines to identify strengths of the proposal.
- 5) Weaknesses (< 200 words)
 - a. Summary outlining the weakness of the proposal
 - a. Revisit the peer review guidelines to identify weaknesses of the proposal.
- 6) Overall assessment (< 100 words)
 - a. Does the proposal warrant funding?
 - b. Please Score/Rank your proposals from 1 to 4 (4=Excellent—no revision needed, 3= Good –minor revisions needed, 2 = OK Major revisions needed, 1 = NOT Good research question vague and major revisions needed)
 - c. Include a brief justification for your ranking that clarifies the strengths and weaknesses of the proposal
- 7) Please upload to ANGEL your TWO reviews as one file on or before Wednesday, March 24th
- 8) Bring hardcopy of the two reviews respective proposals to the Funding panel meetings

Piece of advice – Use the above headings in your formal peer review.
